Great Courses

We have recently begun offering titles from the Great Courses series, which is put out by the Teaching Company. These are college level courses presented by professors who are chosen both for their academic accomplishments and their lecturing skills. They are an excellent way to learn, and there is no homework or exams!

These are shelved with our non-fiction CDs. A full list of available titles can be found in our online catalog by searching for "Great Courses" using the "any field" parameter.

Mango Languages

Our newest electronic resource is Mango Languages, which provides interactive online instruction for twenty-two languages as well as ESL instruction for foreign speakers. Instruction is self-paced. If you create an optional login account, you can stop your session at any time and return at a later date.

This is an excellent resource for students or anyone who would like to learn a new language.

To use this resource, you must have a Kelley Library card and a PIN. To access, simply click the "Research Resources" link on our homepage and choose Mango Languages from the list of offerings.

Big Read NH

The Big Read was started by the National Endowment for the Arts in 2006 and is designed to encourage reading across the country. The program allows people within a community to read and discuss a single book. For approximately one month, each participating community schedules events around the book. This year's selection is *To Kill a Mockingbird*. Harper Lee's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel has been a banned book, was voted the best book of the 20th century, and has

been adapted for theater and film. The book remains relevant today.

The library is hosting three events in March in support of the Big Read. On Thursday, March 4th at 7 p.m. there will be a film screening of the classic adaptation of *To Kill a Mockingbird*, starring Gregory Peck. The following week, on Wednesday, March 10th at 7 p.m., join a discussion of *Mockingbird: A Portrait of Harper Lee*, by Charles Shields. Finally, on March 24th, there will be a book discussion of *To Kill a Mockingbird*.
